
- 1. Parks Support and facilitate improvements in Albert and Gerstle Parks, the open spaces and the

Kearsley Higgins, GPNA Schools Liaison San Rafael City Schools is continuing its work developing a plan as to how to use the

bond measures approved by voters this past November. The School Board met in early January to discuss an implementation plan for all the schools in the district. The plan has not yet been approved, but currently it shows the first construction work beginning this summer at Davidson. The rebuild of Short is currently set for summer 2017 and the rebuild of Laurel Dell would not begin until summer 2019. These schedules could change, as the plan has not yet been approved. When Short and Laurel Dell are rebuilt, the students will have to relocate for at

Plans have been submitted to the City to replace the home at 105 Greenwood Ave. The current home has many problems, and it appears demolition is in order. The nearby neighbors have had a meeting about this project. Another project is on Ross Terrace which is accessed from the west end of Clayton Street. It used to terminate at a stairway to Ross Street. The stairway was declared as being unsafe by the City years ago and never replaced. There are two vacant land parcels on Ross Terrace both adjacent to each other and under common ownership. Proposed is a new single family home on each parcel and a lot line adjustment.

Neighborhood Interview Pub Owners Alex and Lisa Stricker

I catch up with the busy new owners of the State Room, formerly the Broken Drum on 4th St., just after the lunch rush. Alex and Lisa Stricker have had a lot on their plate in the past three years. Although they've lived in San Rafael for ten years, they made the move to Gerstle Park just three years ago. At the same time, they purchased and renovated the old Flatiron Bar at 724 B Street, had a new daughter, and recently purchased and renovated the State Room Brewery. The Strickers are equally invested in making these two bar/restaurants successful, and from all appearances they have done so.

The State Room has been transformed into a modern welcoming space, with clean lines, an open feel and a new menu, in the style of a "Gastro pub." It used to attract a narrow spectrum of customers, but is now filled with people all ages and tastes. The day I was there, there were families with children, young sports enthusiasts and a variety of "ladies who lunch," very much in evidence. Two games played on the TVs while jazz piano music set the ambiance. I enjoyed a lunch of sautéed shrimp with garlic and chili flakes and glass of their very good house Chardonnay.

The Flatiron has been upgraded as well, blending a vintage sports bar feel with modern touches, a menu with an amazing array of burgers, salads, appetizers and sandwiches, and an extensive happy hour menu. It is now truly more than a sports bar, although the sports theme is definitely still its biggest draw.

Lisa says, after they found the perfect rental in Gerstle Park, they were ready for their new enterprise as bar/restaurant owners, and someday hope to be able to buy in the neighborhood. "It has always been a dream of mine to own a restaurant," says Alex.

"And now I have two. One day I hope to have an upscale cocktail bar as well." For the present time though, they are busy enough running two thriving pub/restaurants and raising a young child. Before acquiring the two local establishments, Alex owned the Triumph skate shop in downtown San Rafael and Lisa worked as a childcare provider and in nutrition. "I always had something to do with restaurants," says Lisa, "but never on the management side." The two are constant presences in their new businesses to make sure it runs smoothly. One thing Alex and Lisa miss is having more time to spend with their daughter and their two beagles, Charlie and Newman." We welcome the Strickers to Gerstle Park!

Property owners are in a "holding pattern" as we await further news on Sidewalk Repair Policy from the City of San Rafael. GPNA received the following update from SR Director of Public Works Dean Allison on Feb 25th:

"As many of you know, the City of San Rafael does not currently have a formal sidewalk maintenance policy or budget. Sidewalk improvements compete with street improvements, potholes, curb and gutter maintenance, and ADA accessibility improvements. The City Council asked staff to research the extent of the problem in San Rafael, best practices and what other cities do to address this issue, maintenance and replacement techniques, as well as policy and funding options for solving this problem. Staff received some initial feedback from the City Council and plans to conduct community meetings to get your input on the various elements of a formal sidewalk maintenance policy and procedures. Our goal is to get community input and establish a policy so construction can begin before the next rainy season. We will be in touch with you within the next month to set up a meeting with your neighborhood association. If you have questions, please email:
