Short School Report

GPNA continues to be a part of the development of Short School. We participated in the first meeting in a "master planning" process, which looks at the needs of Short and all school district sites. GPNA expressed that Short should be upgraded so its facilities and programs are as appealing as other schools in the district. We also voiced concerns about how the school would handle growing enrollment and its effect on parking and safety. Overall, we are optimistic that the district is working with our community and is committed to improving the facilities at Short School.

Expansion plans for Short are moving forward. This summer, the district will add a large multi-purpose portable structure on west side of the parking lot. Several classroom portables will be added near the Clorinda/Marin Street corner in summer of 2015. By fall of 2016, Short will have more than 200 students and will be a standard K-5 elementary school. We have been assured by the district that these structures will be a temporary short-term solution to deal with immediate enrollment needs. The master plan work will define the long-term plan. Sun Valley School is the designated neighborhood elementary school for Gerstle Park West of D Street and Laurel Dell for Gerstle Park East of D Street. Short will continue to be a school of choice, along with all of the other schools in San Rafael pending space availability.

Sidewalk Improvements

The San Rafael Dept. of Public Works (DPW) painted numerous sidewalks west of D Street to indicate damage. Red marks indicate "trip" hazards and white marks indicate portions to be replaced.

On May 14, 2014, the GPNA hosted a public meeting with the DPW to look at causes of and possible solutions for the damage. It was explained that under state law, property owners are responsible for the upkeep of adjacent sidewalks. Quite a few years ago, the City took care of this, but not anymore. Over 40 questions were asked by property owners and were answered by the Director of Public Works, Nader Mansourian. The discussion was lively, informative and very comprehensive. There was public interest in several options:

- 1. Partnering with the DPW in a cost-effective manner to take advantage of a "group discount" with a designated contractor and each homeowner who chose to participate paid approximately \$240 per 6'x4' section of sidewalk. The City has agreed to remove the root problem and trees that cannot be saved and the curbs and gutters, where applicable, at no cost. The contractor would remove the old sidewalk and the contractor would then install the new sidewalk. The homeowner must discuss this with the Public Works Department on a case-by-case basis, and the homeowner will decide what is best.
- 2. Requesting the City budget for GP sidewalk improvements in the 2015 fiscal year budget. Some residents may pursue this option. Property owners whose sidewalks require improvement, according to City criteria for safety, have been contacted by the City. Gerstle Park Neighbor – Meet Tamra Peters

Director of the Resilient Neighborhoods Program

Q: What is the Resilient Neighborhoods program?

A: People in Marin do their part to address Climate Change by reducing their own carbon emissions. Our role is to help families build resilience in their community by getting to know their neighbors and being prepared for disruptions like flooding, wildfires, earthquakes or other emergencies.

Q: How does it work?

A: The Program works by people joining an "EcoTeam." Each household calculates its household carbon footprint, then takes actions that reduce household CO2 emissions by at least 5,000 pounds.

Q: How effective has it been?

A: So far 30 EcoTeams comprised of 160 households have reduced their CO2 emissions by a total of over 2,000,000 pounds! Most people don't realize that there are very simple things they can do that make a big difference. We are now written into the San Rafael General Plan because the City recognized how important citizen action is to meeting our climate goals.

Q: Why did you start the program?

A: I feel that Climate Change is the most important issue of our time. I was looking to empower people to do something about Climate Change, because people are frustrated about Washington not doing enough.

Open Space Issues: Call Police & Fire

The eyes of the community are the residents. The police cannot possibly patrol each open space area daily. The two part time Police Department Open Space Rangers are extremely busy. They need the eyes of the public. When you see something wrong – you need to call the police or the fire department. Too often hikers, bikers, dog walkers and runners who take the same route daily say, "Oh yea, that guy has camped there for months and nobody does anything about it". When asked if he/she called the police the answer is usually no. We have to involve ourselves. To ignore the problem makes you part of the problem and not the solution.

On May 18, there was a fire in the Open Space adjacent to Gerstle Park. The fire could have easily devastated our neighborhood. Thanks to the response from County firefighters, the fire was contained, but more than 50 Redwoods were charred. Evidence of camping materials was found in the area.

San Rafael City Ordinances prohibit camping and fires in our fragile Open Spaces, and this is critical to everyone's safety. Please call the police if you witness campers; it is the City's policy to remove campsites because of fire danger. When you call your identification will be never be revealed to the culprit. If you leave an anonymous call, the police and fire cannot get additional information that only you have. San Rafael Police non-emergency number is 485-3000. Always call 911 if there is an emergency.
