

A Gracious Slice of Old San Rafael in Gerstle Park

I meet Jim and Judy Dowling on the veranda of the historic **Gerstle Park Inn**, at 34 Grove Street, just off San Rafael, near leafy Gerstle Park. The Dowlings bought the property in 1995 and restored what had been a drug and alcohol rehab facility to a beautiful and historically accurate structure.



Originally the Inn was one of several buildings on two properties built in the 1880's by two influential San Rafael families, the Gerstles and Schlosses. When the families merged through marriage, the estates became one. An arsonist destroyed the main home in the 1950s leaving the smaller future Inn building and a carriage house that is now home to the Dowlings.

Remnants of a large redwood grove, some awe-inspiring oak and cedars and a fruit orchard provide plenty of charm, peace and tranquility to the setting. The Dowlings spent many months renovating the building and grounds, a pleasant respite from their years in corporate management.

They were ready to settle down when they bought the property and made it into an Inn, one that receives visitors from around the world, half of them repeat customers.

Jim does all the maintenance work, Judy the bookkeeping and they both work on the elaborate breakfasts they serve



their guests. The omelet list alone would be worth the visit. "It's my favorite part of the job," says Jim, whose years in hotel management kept him apart from the guests. "I love to see my guests and hear their stories."

"We've seen their kids grow up over the years," adds Judy, as many of their regulars have families in the area and return to this spot for holidays and family reunions.

"We don't advertise much," says Judy. "We like it quiet here and so do our guests," so there are no weddings or large events. But a spacious conference room is available for special meetings.

They cater to a diverse crowd. Most of their trade comes from locals, friends and family who come to visit. They also get business travelers and visitors from San Francisco, looking for a getaway. One half are repeat visitors. Loyal guests are vocal in their praise of Gerstle Park Inn and of the 10 hotels in San Rafael reviewed by the Tripdadvisor site the Inn rates a solid number 1, a fact of which the Dowlings are understandably proud.

When asked what they liked least about running a large upscale B and B, they both laugh, and Jim exclaims, "Plumbing!" They also wish they could travel more, but acknowledge they enjoy being in such a beautiful setting, among the trees, which is one perk of running this business.

"We have to be available 24/7, in case of emergencies," says Judy. Sometimes people call for rooms in the middle of the night, using the emergency line. "Europeans especially like to be spontaneous and don't make reservations ahead, so we have had the occasional 4 AM call," says Judy.

"Many of the guests go sightseeing in wine country or the City during the day," says Jim, "so our only time to be with them is breakfast." The Dowlings also love Thanksgiving and Christmas time, says Judy.

I was surprised to learn that many Gerstle Park residents don't know about the Inn. That's a shame, because it's the perfect place for that next family reunion.
