Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Training: Starts Sept 4th

In the event of a major disaster, professional emergency services may be overwhelmed and unavailable for long periods of time. The widespread needs of the community will depend upon voluntary assistance. With this in



mind, the local governments in Marin County have adopted a citizen training program called Community Emergency Response Training (CERT). CERT is designed to provide hands-on training to become self-sufficient for at least 72 hours following a disaster such as an earthquake, flood, or a wildfire.

CERT teams are trained in basic emergency response procedures such as:

- Conducting an initial size-up of the situation in their immediate area
- Reducing immediate dangers by turning off utilities, suppressing small fires, and evacuating hazardous areas
- Performing immediate medical triage and basic treatment of injuries
- Assessing structural integrity and performing light search and rescue
- Collecting and recording vital information to be relayed to professional responders on damage, victims, and actions taken or resources needed
- Providing leadership to untrained volunteers

San Rafael Office of Emergency Services (OES) is offering the CERT Basic class:

15 hours: Tuesday September 4, 11, 18, 25 and October 2 from 6-9pm. The cost of the class is \$45.

Report - Residential Support Facility Ordinance Amendments, Info Meeting June 28th

Our neighborhood was eloquently represented by GPNA Pro Bono Attorney, George Silvestri as city officials explained amendments to current zoning ordinances as they pertain to unregulated group homes known as "residential support facilities" in the amendment document. George maintained our position that adequate health and safety standards must be met to protect residents inside group homes as well as their neighbors. He voiced concern that the amendment's "ministerial" v. "discretionary" planning approval process does not allow for a public hearing and decisions are not appealable, notice for planning approval is only distributed to adjacent properties and he had a number of other concerns which will be submitted in writing to the City Attorney's office. The proposed amendments, if adopted this fall by the City Council, represent the regulation of the Sober Living Facilities that house more than 6 residents plus staff. Although imperfect as they stand, the recommendations are a victory for governance.

I was pleased to learn that all "residential support facilities" would be governed by these amendments regardless of their start date.

The amendments will be sent to the Planning Commission for approval in Sept/Oct and on to the City Council for hearings and vote in Oct/Nov.

More on San Rafael's Homeless

Reporting in from the San Rafael Group, an independent organization of San Rafael residents and business people working to better the City's approach to the homelessness problem. The group recognizes the accomplishments of the social service agencies, but focuses on the problems that many of us see everyday in parks, the open space, neighborhoods and downtown. We are seeking solutions to the problems.

Mayor Phillips and Councilman Levine oversee a City Council Homeless Committee. The committee has already met once and there will be more meetings coming. Hugo Landecker, who is head of San Rafael Group, has been appointed to the committee and has submitted a long list of issues he expects will be addressed and rectified.

You will probably be hearing about a plan to have downtown street teams to deal with homeless problems. All the information at this date is very tentative.

New Pick Up Program for Batteries, Paint, Oil and Other Household Waste

A pilot Household Universal Waste Pick-Up Program (HUWPUP) started on July 5 in San Rafael. Residents can call the Household Hazardous Waste line at 485-6806 for an appointment to have their household universal waste picked up at their home for a \$25 fee. HUWPUP will accept universal waste such as household batteries, fluorescent bulbs, cell phones, computer monitors and other e-waste, as well as latex paint, oil, and oil filters. Residents must be home for the pick-up appointment and must sign a receipt.

Activity on SMART Line

You may have seen activity on the SMART rail line in North San Rafael over the past few weeks. SMART personnel, working with the SRFD, have completed weed abatement and vegetation management. SMART has informed the City they will be working on the actual rails from Civic Center Drive to Smith Ranch Road from mid July to October.
