We had an informative neighborhood meeting at the Panama Hotel with special guest Jim Forsythe, San Rafael Streets Superintendant. During the social time before the meeting, neighbors enjoyed conversations with new neighbors and old friends. Hugo Landecker teamed with Jim Forsythe from the Public Works Maintenance Department to discuss neighborhood problems that we get help on from Public Works. Street sweeping was discussed and good suggestions came from the audience for improving notification to residents. Public Works removes abandoned items from street corners. They report that in some instances they have been able to identify those responsible and the consequences are severe. Last year DPW removed at least 200 tons of this debris. Public Works also removes debris from campsites in our open space. Recently 30 tons was cleaned from San Rafael Hill. We suggest you take a walk along the fire road that leads to D Street. You will see a huge change, if you haven't been there for awhile. Volunteers work daily to extend these cleared areas and you are welcome you to join us. Fresh air, accomplishment and exercise are the results. Much better than being on a treadmill! Our removal season usually ends about May 1 depending on weather. Once it gets warm, the earth dries and makes removal difficult. Our open space project is now in about the 20th year. When we first started, nobody realized that we had an open space area. You couldn't have even hiked it if you tried. Now the area has become a neighborhood asset and is used daily by hikers and dog walkers.

# D Street Paving - Time to Check Your Sewer Laterals

If you own property on D Street, you probably received a letter from the Department of Public Works in November 2012. The DPW asks the property owners to check their sewer lateral and, if needed, make necessary repairs before the City paves D Street. What does this mean for property owners? The sewer laterals (sewer lines that connect to the City's main line) are the property owners' responsibility. Laterals can be impacted by tree roots and might need replacement. Many of these laterals are over 100 years old. To be on the safe side, owners should use an inspection service.

Once the street is paved, there will be a "5 year moratorium" for digging in the street. For those who choose not to make necessary repairs the penalty will be very expensive. As the weather improves the DPW will resume the repaving projects. This may occur in mid or late March. Signs will be posted. # Community Development Projects

GPNA works with the San Rafael Community Development Department on new projects in and around our neighborhood. When building projects come up, we review the plans for code compliance and make every effort to maintain the character of the area. Sometimes we can even make things better for the applicant and the neighborhood. One project in the pipeline is a new 4-story building at the NW corner of Second and B Streets. The ground level will be parking with retail on the B Street frontage. This will be topped with 3 stories of apartments.

There have been numerous proposals for this building and though the design keeps getting better, there's still a ways to go. Developers plan to demolish the two Victorians on the site, one of which is a burned out building on the San Rafael List of Historical and Architectural Sites. We are unsure if the developer will be forced to restore this building. Such buildings come under California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) so demolition gets complicated. Although the proposed parking for this site meets minimum requirements, we anticipate that our neighborhood will be impacted by overflow parking.

### Homelessness in San Rafael

Community Action Marin now has a CARE Team that deals with those in mental crisis. They will travel anywhere a problem is occurring have resources for follow up care. CARE Team members are specially trained and work closely with the San Rafael Police Department. The CARE Team has already proven their worth. If you see a need for this care, please call 415-847-1266.

Recently the San Rafael City Council voted unanimously to support a Downtown Street Team for the homeless. This program was developed for Palo Alto where it been very successful. The goals of the program are to provide training in basic job and job-seeking skills, help with job applications, motivational training, part-time employment and possibly housing. Participants are paid with stipends and not cash. The employment involves cleaning up downtown and perhaps contracting with local businesses for various services. We are unsure when the program will start, but City Hall is working on it. The criteria for participation are punctuality, sobriety and work readiness. If these expectations are not met, the person is out of the program but may come back and try again and some do.
