PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The Spring Fling has "flung" and 2007 is well underway. There is much to report, so I'll jump right in. First of all, one of our favorite and biggest events is approaching! **The neighborhood-wide Garage Sale is on June 9th**. Get your applications in early!

In the last newsletter we reported the results of the recent, though limited, priority survey taken earlier this year. Those who voted determined the number one priority to be for the Board to represent GPNA interests to the City of San Rafael City Council, City Staff and Federation of San Rafael Neighborhoods. Board member, Brigette Waterbury and I took the first step by meeting with our City Manager, Ken Nordhoff. We expressed our goal, as a Board, to improve the quality and nature of communication between the neighborhood and the city.

Ken was very interested in the Neighborhood Priority Survey. He emphasized the value of concrete data to consider when making decisions about how to support Gerstle Park. The city prefers to make decisions based on neighborhood preferences as a whole rather than individual requests, which are often sources of disagreement for others.

As a united neighborhood, we have significantly more influence on the city's decisions of how they apply resources. Therefore, the Board has decided to mount a neighborhood-wide distribution of the Priority Survey. The results will shape the Board's priorities and empower our community to have a significant impact on city decisions. The survey will be mailed to you in May. Here is your chance to make a difference in the community. Please fill it out and send it back promptly.

For an update on the status of neighborhood traffic matters and our Traffic Committee's plans and activities, please go to www.gerstlepark.com. We will keep you informed when community meetings and presentations will be held to allow you to assess the impacts and any proposed changes for yourselves.

Finally, I would like to reiterate that we have two openings on the board. Talk about having a good time! Here's the opportunity to make a great difference in your own neighborhood, learn how civic affairs are managed, meet your neighbors, and fill those idle hours. SAVE THE DATE! GPNA NEIGHBORHOOD-WIDE GARAGE SALE

Saturday, June 9th, 9:00 am - 2:00 pm

It's time to empty your closets and storage areas, and sell all that old good stuff that's been taking up space for too long! Last year, folks cleared out their basements and cupboards and replaced that "stuff" with some CASH. The garage sale also enabled the GPNA to fund several neighborhood events.

GPNA is sponsoring our 13th Annual Garage Sale at participating residences throughout the neighborhood. This is a coordinated and publicized neighborhood-wide garage sale that attracts hopeful bargain hunters from all over. It is a wonderful chance to get out and mix with your neighbors and meet new folks while helping out our neighborhood.

Here's how it works: Register to participate with the GPNA and you will be included on the official map of sales and join in the fun! You'll enjoy the benefits of lots of shoppers pulled in by our coordinated publicity in the IJ, craigslist, several community listings, flyers, and you'll be provided with large signs to hang at your residence identifying you as a GPNA supporter and participant.

The publicity will include clear directions on where to obtain GPNA garage sale maps. The maps will be available at buyer information stands located at 1st and D, San Rafael Ave. and D, and Bayview and B. To be included on the official map, you must register before June 4th. Your registration fee (1) puts your address on the map, (2) gets your sale items listed, (3) provides you with an official event sign, (4) provides you with coordinated advertising and (5) helps to support GPNA. Late registrations past June 4th are okay and you will get a sign but won't have items or your address listed on the official map. The registration fees pay for the ads, the maps and the signs, with all remaining proceeds going to support the Gerstle Park Neighborhood Association.

Of course, all of the proceeds from your sale are yours to keep! If you don't want to run a garage sale but have a few quality items you'd like to donate to the GPNA to sell for you, note the drop-

off information on the registration form and those items will be sold the day of the sale at the GPNA table with proceeds used to support GPNA activities and the newsletter.

If you are a current member of GPNA, your registration fee is \$20.00. If you are not a current member, your registration fee is \$30.00, which includes your garage sale registration and activates your GPNA membership until January 2008.

SHORT SCHOOL, SHORT STORY, GREAT OUTCOME

Early April brought a flurry of activity in our neighborhood around Short School on Marin Street. Concerned neighbors called and emailed Board members when they spotted an ugly, prison-style, chain link fence being erected around the front of the school. We quickly contacted Chris Thomas, San Rafael City School Facilities Director. Chris was wonderfully responsive and immediately drove over to see exactly what was happening. She halted the erection of the fence, made sure the correct size fence was put in the right place and went the extra mile by insisting that a green fence, better fitting into our neighborhood, was installed instead. So, hurrah and thank you to Chris and to all of the players involved in nipping that eyesore in the bud!

Chris informed us that the Short School would continue to be used as a school. Here is the relevant excerpt from her timely letter:

"Keystone Schools has leased Short School for three years from San Rafael City Schools to serve children in Kindergarten through third grade who have special learning needs. The program is designed for small-group work with less than twelve students per class, and enrollment is not expected to exceed seventy-five to one hundred students. Keystone School is scheduled to open its program for students in May 2007, once the grounds and buildings have been prepared for the students. Plans include placement of additional fencing in front of the school to increase security and keep students safe from the street."

Let's welcome our new neighbors. If all goes well we won't have to worry about how that property is developed for a good long time!

SPRING FLING RECAP

This year's spring fling event was a huge success. A few changes this year were met with great enthusiasm. First, the age range was extended to include eight-year olds who still very much enjoy Easter egg hunting. Second, the actual hunting was divided into two groups with the smaller kids' eggs hidden in the lower playground area. This helped keep the event safer for the little ones and made for less crowded conditions for all attending. And last, a balloon artist was on hand to engage the children while everyone was waiting for the hunt to begin. The event started at 9:00 and was still going strong at 11:30 with many local families continuing to enjoy our own beautiful Gerstle Park on a beautiful day. GPNA BEGINNINGS

Some of you are curious about how GPNA began. Originally our neighborhood was mostly single-family homes. Sometime, in the 1950s the developed areas were rezoned to high density residential. As time went on, many fine old homes were demolished and new high-density apartments were constructed. It became obvious that this trend could not continue and still have Gerstle Park retain its character and charm.

About 1972 a small group of residents held a series of informal meetings. The intention was to organize with the objective of preserving the remaining character of the neighborhood. Someone came up with the idea that we should have an association. Continued discussions ironed out the details, such as neighborhood boundaries. Originally the first

proposal was to have the neighborhood west of D Street. Someone said that the problems east of D Street were the same as to the west and so the boundary was moved to B Street. Then came the discussion whether to be a homeowners association or a neighborhood association. Well, that was simple; it was decided to include renters, which qualified us as a neighborhood association. Lastly, we needed a name until Cynthia Landecker suggested, "Gerstle Park Neighborhood Association" and so we began.

The next step was to form a Board of Directors and elect officers. The first president was Mike Flynn who lived on Estates Court. Mike led us down the path to a set of by-laws and articles. In 1973 we had our first annual picnic. It continues today only through the strength of our members. If you are not already a member, please consider joining and being a part of keeping Gerstle Park the wonderful neighborhood it is.

UPCOMING VEGETATION MANAGEMENT ORDINANCE

To prevent urban wildfires such as the 1991 Oakland Hills fire, California has mandated that all cities and counties adopt a vegetation management ordinance by 2008. The San Rafael Fire Department is developing the ordinance and while it is changing almost daily at this point, here's how it stands now.

Approximately 60% of the Gerstle Park neighborhood will be affected: All areas west of Clark Street, Woods Street, upper Ross Street, Miramar, Miraflores, parts of Grove Street, Gerstle Park, South end of C Street and the hill areas on the east side of the neighborhood.

As currently written, the ordinance has confusing language and requirements. We all care about fire prevention and this ordinance will have widespread impact on vegetation management rules. Several Board and community members are working with the Fire Department on the ordinance so it is crafted to best serve our community. THE FEDERATION OF SAN RAFAEL NEIGHBORHOODS: WORKING TOGETHER TO BUILD A STRONGER COMMUNITY

Founded in 1992, the Federation has served as an umbrella and advocacy group for all neighborhoods in San Rafael, south of Puerto Suello Hill. The group provides a neighborhood and community perspective on key issues in San Rafael. The Federation addresses multi-neighborhood and city issues that cross over neighborhood boundaries and impact a number of neighborhoods. The group works to bring attention to these types of items, interact with City staff and decision makers, and provide a network to foster collaboration between its members. The Federation supports neighborhoods in attaining solutions on issues they may be struggling with and provides guidance on navigating the San Rafael system for newcomers.

Federation members are individuals, homeowners and neighborhood associations. Gerstle Park Neighborhood Association is a long-standing member. As it turns out, this years Chair, Steve Patterson, and Vice-Chair, Tymber Cavasian both live in Gerstle Park! The Steering Committee members cover 11 different neighborhoods, with

membership adding in many, many more. This year several initiatives were identified for Federation efforts including: trees, development process and design, traffic calming, historic preservation, review of downtown planning applications, and conducting more forums, such as the Transportation Forum they held last Fall.

Monthly meetings are the 3rd Wednesday of each month at 7:00 pm and are held at the Lindaro Corporate Center in either the Boro or Tam room. The Agenda usually includes an interesting guest speaker and everyone is welcome to attend. The Federation also meets monthly with the City Manager

on the first Thursday of each month at 10:00 am in City Hall. "Neighborhood Speak", a monthly article written by the Federation, also appears in the local paper, the San Rafael Newspointer.
