# **National Night Out**

- 4. Send a message to criminals letting them know neighborhoods are organized and fighting back.

# 'San Rafael Group' – Neighborhood Response to Homeless Issues

Our downtown has been plagued with increasing incidents of aggressive street people which then spill over to surrounding neighborhoods. Many Gerstle Park residents hesitate to go downtown due to this problem. The downtown business owners are experiencing incidents that are far beyond what the normal person can imagine. Hugo Landecker has started an email group to address this issue. Currently the group has 125 addressees including 46 business owners and managers. The group recognizes the many commendable successes the social service agencies have accomplished. But this email group is about finding solutions to these problems.

We recently had a meeting with Mayor Phillips and Councilman McCullough. Upcoming will be a meeting with Councilman Levine, Chair of the City Council sub-committee on homelessness.
