Planning Issues

There is a proposal to demolish the existing building at 1415 3rd Street. Planned is a new building to be used as a dialysis facility. As proposed, the building's architecture just simply does not fit San Rafael the Mission City. Although our City has very specific standards for parking, the developer will seek exceptions to the standards. The SR Design Review Board, in a split decision, approved the architecture. There are more hearings on the project expected.
